Tuesday, 7am - 8:30am



If you miss one of the classes, you may come to the Wednesday group (19h - 20h30) or watch the recording. This semester, we will discuss masters like Poe, Chekhov, Mark Twain or the Brothers Grimm; study amazing 20th-century writers like Ursula Le Guin, Chinua Achebe and Dorothy Parker; and amuse ourselves with two outstanding poets: Lord Byron and Dr Seuss! This course costs R\$ 250 a month and it is ideal for those who are in a rush but still want to learn literature and English!






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


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All Our Readings



Our students are welcome to move between courses as they please — provided that they have the same frequency and price. For example, it is possible for someone to follow the **Novels Advanced** course for two months (The Great Gatsby and The Gambler), then move to the **Novels Big Reads** for another two months (Pride and Prejudice), and finish the last one at the **Novels Intermediate** course (Ethan Frome). Similarly, if he or she wishes, a student from the **Short Stories** course is free to change to the **Read in Class** for some time — and vice-versa. The flexibility is intended to help our students follow **their personal interests** and **manage the amount of time** they have available to read.
