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In the Short Stories course, we read one **short story of up to 10 pages per week**. The idea is to have a light reading load while still discovering the works of great authors from around the world! Classes are taught by **Ana** and take place **every Tuesday**. If you miss one of the classes, you may watch the recording or **come to the Wednesday group (13h - 14h30)**. The course is open to students from the Intermediate and Advanced levels and we make **all the short stories available to them**. This semester, we will read fairy tales by Hans Christian Andersen, enjoy horror stories by Bram Stoker and Shirley Jackson, and laugh out loud with George Saunders and Oscar Wilde! Plus, we will discover masterpieces by three Nobel-prize winners: Nadine Gordimer, Herman Hesse and William Faulkner! This is the ideal course for those with **limited time for reading** but who want to **practice English with higher frequency**.

# All Our Readings



Our students are welcome to move between courses as they please — provided that they have the same frequency and price. For example, it is possible for someone to follow the **Novels Advanced** course for two months (The Great Gatsby and The Gambler), then move to the **Novels Big Reads** for another two months (Pride and Prejudice), and finish the last one at the **Novels Intermediate** course (Ethan Frome). Similarly, if he or she wishes, a student from the **Short Stories** course is free to change to the **Read in Class** for some time — and vice-versa. The flexibility is intended to help our students follow **their personal interests** and **manage the amount of time** they have available to read.
